I. Committee Meetings (20 minutes)

*Committees met for 20 minutes prior to beginning the general senate meeting.*

II. Call to Order

**Alex Kim** called the meeting to order at 5:24PM

III. Approval of the Agenda

**Dan Boirum** moved to place R-12-26 as the first item under new business, and place OA-12-5 as the fifth item of new business. *Seconded. Objection.*

*The motion failed.*

**Alex Kim** entertained a motion to place OA-12-3 as the final item of new business.

*So moved. Seconded. Passed without objection.*

**Andrew Everett** moved to place R-12-26 as the second item under new business. *Seconded. Objection.*

*The motion failed.*

**Travis McCoy** moved to approve the agenda. *Seconded. Passed without objection.*

IV. Committee Reports

**Faculty and Administrative Affairs** – The committee planned a committee party

**Academic Affairs** – The committee discussed paper bill

**Publicity and Outreach Committee** – The committee discussed the effectiveness of announcements

**Membership Committee** – The committee had no report

**Campus Affairs** – The committee discussed OA-12-5

**Off Campus Affairs** – The committee discussed the online commuter forum. It was noted that the beta version is ready on the Senate forums.

**General Affairs** – The committee discussed R-12-31 and tabled it until next week

#### V. Chair's Report

**Alex Kim** noted that the first ever marriage equality rally took place in the HUB this afternoon. He thanked Karl Smith for his efforts with the event.

He noted that the Fair Trade Coffee Coalition has a new section on the Senate forum.

He said the inaugural meeting on Qolors was this afternoon and that it was a great accomplishment for the GBLTQ community

It was noted that next week was rape and sexual assault prevention week. Events include the film Born Into Brothels would show on Tuesday in the HUB, and a Thursday rally in red-square with Coach Romar.

**Ted Stone** noted that Tuesday at 4:30 next week would be a candidate info session for the ASUW Board of Directors.

He recognized Sean Kellogg and Cammie Croft who attended the meeting.

#### VI. ASUW Presidential Privilege

**Jon Lee** noted that Lee Dunbar was at the North of 45<sup>th</sup> meeting.

#### VII. Board of Directors Report

He said it was the last week to turn in applications for the position of Student Regent.

He noted the position included full tuition payment and was the only voting student on the Board.

He said the application was available at [www.asuw.org](http://www.asuw.org)

He said ASUW was going to hold the first ASUW Job Fair on Wed, April 5<sup>th</sup> from 11-2 on the HUB lawn.

**Karl Smith** noted that the Board of Directors created a commission for disabled students.

He said the Board is looking into codifying the role of commissions in the association.

He said Senate's motion to put the Vice Chair on the Board of Directors has gone through judicial and will be on the ballot this year.

**Jon Lee** said the President's advisory commission would be on campus on Friday and encouraged students to attend the meeting in the HUB in room 209B.

### VIII. Graduate and Professional Student Senate Report

**Sean Kellogg** said GPSS was considering a resolution to change their stance on the 520 onramp issue.

**Andrew Everett** asked what the new position was on I-520

**Sean Kellogg** said it called for support of the legislation.

### IX. Orders of the Day

#### **A. New Business**

##### OA-12-5 An Act to Honor the U.S. Military in Iraq

**Travis Grandy**, as chair of the committee that considered the legislation, presented the resolution.

It was noted that the Membership Committee passed it with an unfavorable recommendation.

**Angie Wallace** asked if it were feasible to form a committee and draw up a proposal by the end of May.

**Jon Lee** said it would have to be presented to the UW Landscape Committee and that no real action would be taken until the next fall.

**Andrew Everett** asked why the original legislation was modified into an Organic Act.

**Travis Grandy** said it changed from calling for the creation from a committee to the actual creation of such a committee

**Angie Wallace** asked about funding the project.

**Travis Grandy** said the issue would be addressed by the committee.

**Travis McCoy** moved to close debate. *Seconded. Objection.*

*The motion passed.*

R-12-29 A Resolution Admonishing the Discriminatory Military Recruitment at the University of Washington

**Bryce McKibben**, sponsor of the legislation, presented the resolution.

It was noted the committee passed the resolution with a favorable recommendation with a minority report.

**Travis McCoy** strongly encouraged senators to check the online Senate forum to catch up on the extensive and informed debate that had taken place there.

**Max Wagner** said he thought the issue of military recruiters and the DADT policy were two different issues.

**Bryce McKibben** said the two were related as military recruiters were forced to execute the DADT policy.

**Mikhail Smirnoff** asked if the whereas clause condemns military recruiters' presence on campus.

**Bryce McKibben** said it condemned their presence as they execute the DADT policy

**John Naughton** asked if there was an operational definition of the "pursue" clause in the DADT policy.

**Bryce McKibben** said that the clause is supposed to prevent individuals from seeking out sexual preferences, but that it was being done anyway. He said he would bring information to the next meeting.

**Dan Boirum** clarified that the full phrase was "Don't ask, don't tell, don't harass, don't pursue"

**Brandt Hofstetter** asked if it was possible to change the resolution to reflect the fact that individuals are punished for homosexual conduct, not for being homosexual.

**Bryce McKibben** said it was going to have to be debated the close correlation between orientation and conduct.

**Brant Hofstetter** said he thought the phrase "discrimination and attacks" needed to be clarified.

**Bryce McKibben** said it was defined as physical or verbal harassment as defined in the DADT policy.

**Erin Shields** asked what format the disclaimer policy would take.

**Bryce McKibben** said he thought the issue needed better defining, but that the general idea was the posting of a placard next to recruiters.

**Alex Kim** asked if he thought such an act would violate any laws.

**Bryce McKibben** said that it wouldn't, as the Supreme Court recently ruled such acts were protected as freedom of speech.

**Shawn Fisher** asked if the legislation was against recruiters or the policy they were asked to uphold.

**Bryce McKibben** said it was against the policy itself.

**Mikhail Smirnoff** asked about the University policy, specifically the parts that seem to allow for the military to be on campus.

**Bryce McKibben** said when the legislation was written, there wasn't enough research done on the matter. He said it has now been noted that sexual orientation is not included in portions of the non-discrimination policy. He said plans are being made for future resolutions to address the issue.

**Tyler Dockins** asked what format a letter from the UW President would take.

**Bryce McKibben** said it wasn't specifically mentioned, but that it could take the form of a speech or official letter and that he thought such details were important to mention.

**Dan Boirum** asked what the intent was behind the "national security" clause as it seemed to be somewhat contradictory.

**Bryce McKibben** said he hoped that the resolution would ultimately result in recruitment coming back to campus in an open and accepting manner.

**Mikhail Smirnoff** asked how much effort was made to separate the DADT and military recruitment issues.

**Bryce McKibben** said there wasn't an effort made because they were directly related and the recruitment efforts brought policies to campus that were contrary to students' morals.

**Erin Shields** asked if there were examples of similar actions at other schools.

**Bryce McKibben** said he thought the issue had been taken up at several law schools.

**Shawn Fisher** said the movement originated in the UC-Santa Clara.

**Mikhail Smirnoff** moved to close debate. Seconded. Passed without objection.

*Debate was closed on the resolution.*

#### R-12-30 A Resolution in Support of the 2006 Hunger Cleanup

**Melissa Aar**, sponsor of the legislation, summarized the resolution.

**John Naughton** moved to amend the first 'that' clause to remove everything after "2006 Hunger Cleanup", and combine the two 'that' clauses. There was no second. The motion failed.

**Travis Grandy** moved to place the word "specifically" before "WashPIRG" in the first 'that' clause. Seconded. Objection.

**John Naughton** said he wanted to move toward a more open statement supporting the event, not the group.

**Erin Shields** asked what the intent of the 'that' clauses was.

**Melissa Aar** said she didn't intend it to be a blanket endorsement of WashPIRG.

**Brent Ludeman** moved to close debate. Seconded. Objection.

*The motion passed.*

*The amendment passed.*

**Kyle Albert** asked if the passage of the resolution would affect the event.

**Melissa Aar** said it was a national event, and that it would proceed regardless.

**Mikhail Smirnoff** asked if Melissa Aar intended to use the resolution to improve attendance at the event.

She said she did.

**Ashley Miller** noted that this was the only way WashPIRG asked for ASUW support.

**Brent Ludemen** moved to close debate. *Seconded. Objection.*

*The motion passed.*

*The resolution passed unanimously.*

R-12-26 A Resolution Calling for a Memorial for UW Alumni awarded the Medal of Honor

**Andrew Everett**, sponsor of the legislation, summarized the resolution.

He said his goal and intent was to honor all Medal of Honor winners who graduated from the UW. He said he wanted to recognize their achievements as being important and remember them.

**Mikhail Smirnoff** said he completely supported the resolution and went above and beyond what the original resolution aimed for. He said students should be proud to associate with such individuals, and that he thought it was important to support such an effort.

**Karl Smith** said he had two issues to consider with this resolution. He said his first issue was that it didn't honor all of those who had sacrificed their lives. He said the second issue was that it didn't honor those who had yet to be awarded a medal.

**Tyler Dockins** said there was precedent to honor those who are Nobel Laureates, and that such an act isn't unprecedented.

**Lee Dunbar** said he had spoken to Weldon Irig about the project. He stressed that students might not agree with individuals who are giving to the memorial, they should understand that such money is being entrusted to the university. He said that as a result, it would be the UW community, including students, who would say what it would look like.

**Deidre Lockman** said she thought the resolution had been hijacked from its original purpose. She said those who had spoken against the original bill have been harassed for expressing their opinions. She said it was important for senators to realize that the current resolution had become a political tool. She said the second issue of the resolution was what actual purpose a memorial would serve. She noted that the Medal of Honor

recipients had still been honored with the highest honor possible in the country, regardless of what action Senate took.

**Sue Ordonez** said that the important fact was that UW would be honoring people who were part of the UW community.

**John Naughton** said he thought passing this resolution was inappropriate given the current political climate. He said that aspects of peace should be remembered, not war.

**Shawn Fisher** said he respected Andrew for his efforts with this bill, and for bringing it back to Senate after having taken Senate's opinion, adjusting his resolution, and bringing it back to Senate.

**Dan Boirum** said he thought the resolution was very appropriate as the UW traditionally has recognized impressive achievements of its students. He said he strongly supported the resolution.

**Travis Grandy** moved to amend the resolution to replace the current 'that' clauses. *Seconded. Objection.*

He said the amendment clarified the original language while still honoring those MoH awardees.

**Travis McCoy** asked if additional memorials would be erected in the future if UW alumni were awarded the Medal of Honor, or if their names would simply be added to the memorial.

**Travis Grandy** responded that their names would be added to the memorial.

**Angie Wallace** moved to amend the amendment to state "THAT additions or modifications be made to the memorial in honor of future UW alumni recipients of the Medal of Honor upon arrangement of necessary funding. *Seconded. Passed without objection.*

*The amendment to the amendment passed.*

**Andrew Everett** moved to strike the word "congressional" from "Congressional Medal of Honor". *Seconded. Passed without objection.*

**Shawn Fisher** said he liked the mention of the funding, but didn't think the use of the word "alumni" was what was intended.

**Andrew Everett** clarified it didn't require individuals to graduate, only attend UW.

**Brandon Gregory** moved to amend the ‘that’ clause from “bravest men” to “bravest citizens”. *Seconded. Objection.*

**Karl Smith** asked if you had to be a citizen to serve in the military

It was noted that those who served did not have to be citizens, but could not be awarded the medal of honor.

*The amendment to the amendment passed.*

**John Naughton** asked about the intent of the wording “the UW produced”.

**Andrew Everett** said that he believed schools have a strong impact on those who attend them.

**Dan Boirum** moved to close debate on the amendment. *Seconded. Passed without objection.*

*The amendment passed unanimously.*

**Mikhail Smirnoff** said he thought the campus needed to get over the initial scandal that took place over the original resolution.

**Andrew Everett** said he agreed with some points Deidre Lockman made. He said the issue has expanded far beyond what he originally wanted to achieve. He said he hoped Senators would vote with their conscious, and not feel pressured by others.

**Max Wagner** said he supported the resolution as it was a worthy cause. He said he thought it unfortunate how divisive the issue had become. He said he thought Senate was above such problems. He said he agreed with Andrew Everett that senators shouldn’t allow larger societal pressure to affect their votes.

**Joel Murray** said the reputation of UW, ASUW, and the student body were on the line.

**Alex Kim** noted that students are the people who are affected most by Senate’s actions.

**Cailin Magruder** said she thought it possible to ignore the honoree’s role in the military and consider them as men of great character. She said she thought the University helped contribute to that.

**Kyle Albert** said he thought not passing the resolution would be a negative thing for UW.

**Sam Al-Khoury** said Senate was playing the game they said they hated by worrying about the politicization of the resolution. He said it should be voted on based on its merits, nothing else.

**Shawn Fisher** moved to close debate. Seconded. Objection.

*Division was called. The motion passed.*

*Debate was closed on the resolution.*

**Brent Ludeman** moved was made for a roll call vote. Seconded. Objection.

**Alex Kim** clarified the procedure for a roll call vote.

*The motion passed.*

*A roll call vote was conducted.*

*The resolution passed. Roll Call votes are recorded in an appendix below.*

**Shawn Fisher** moved to proceed to announcements. Seconded. Passed without objection.

#### X. Announcements

**Marley Blonsky** noted RHSA elections were being conducted this week. Students were encouraged to vote.

**Lee Dunbar** asked senators to contact him if they have any problems with feedback regarding the meeting.
